Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope you have all had a lovely holiday and enjoyed the break with your children. It is great to see them all back in school today and hear of all the exciting things they have been up to and of the presents they were lucky enough to receive.

The spring term is set to be another busy and exciting one. Our new whole school focus is 'Horrible History'.
