Our Extra Curricular Opportunities

Year 3 had their own Stone Age Adventure at Creswell Crags. Creswell Crags is one of the best sights in the country for learning about life in Stone Age Britain as people first started living there around 60,000 years ago. During their trip, they visited a cave, learnt about the many different animals which humans lived alongside in the Stone Age and reconstructed the skeletons of wolves and hyenas so that we could better understand their anatomy.



Year 4 visited University of Nottingham for an aspiration day to encourage children to think about higher education. The children attended a lecture; wrote notes; talked about budgeting and looked at some University accommodation.
