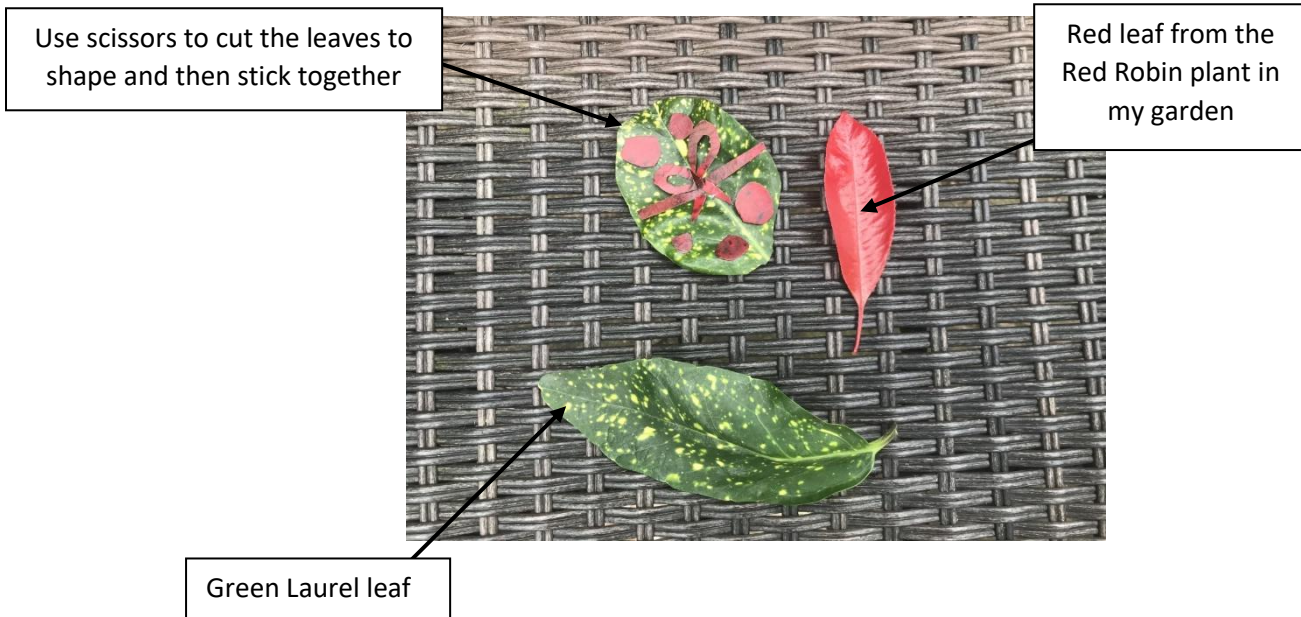


Easter Holiday Activities

🍳 **Make an Easter egg using leaves from your garden...**

Here's one I made earlier.



If you haven't got any glue try finding a light coloured leaf and use felt tips to create your pattern.

Ask your parents' permission to pick the leaves.

Make sure you wash your hands afterwards!

🍳 **Decorate an egg... (If you have one!)**



You could use natural materials, paint, felt tips or use whatever you have at home. Remember wash your hands afterwards!

Create an Easter Egg/Treasure Hunt...

Here are some ideas for clues to find the eggs.

Write out the clues.

Start with number 1, then hide the other clues.

Clue 2 will be hidden where clue 1 takes you to
(Behind the ...?)

Clue 3 will be hidden "... under the garden...?" And so on.

1: If you look
behind the ...?

Your next clue you
will see.

2: Your next clue
could be anywhere...

Go and look under
the garden...?

3: Will you be
the top of the
class?

The next clue
you will find
is on the...?

4: To get the
eggs and
find the lot...

You better
look under
the flower...?

Why not make up your own clues?

You could also make up clues for an Easter egg/treasure hunt inside
your house or google Easter Scavenger hunt clues.

Answers to my clues are: (1: tree 2: chair 3: grass 4: pot)

Decorate a stone



Use felt tips or highlighter pens to decorate a stone or pebble from your garden.

I only had 3 colours to use!

Be creative with your design or message.

It doesn't only have to be about Easter ...

Maybe write your name, draw a picture of a pet or just create a pattern.

The choice is yours.

Remember to wash your hands when you have finished.

Get creative and make a picture with natural materials from your garden.

Remember to wash your hands afterwards.



Make a Noughts and Crosses Game.

Find an object which will represent the Noughts and an object for the Crosses. (You will need 5 of each)

Draw a grid with chalk on the floor or use sticks to make a grid.



I used sticks for the grid.

I used Ivy and Red Robin leaves.

Take it in turns to place your piece on the grid.

Try and block your opponent.

The winner is the one who can get 3 in a row!

Remember to ask your parents' permission before you pick anything from the garden.

... AND WASH YOUR HANDS AFTERWARDS!

Get Close to nature



Spring has arrived! Wildlife and birds can now be seen in our gardens.

Why not be a nature detective and make a list of all the creatures you can find.

You could:

Draw a detailed picture of them.

Research facts about them.

Draw a map of where you found them.

Make a "Creatures in my Garden" booklet.

You must always return any mini-beasts back to where you found them.

You must wash your hands afterwards!
