


Curriculum Map – Changes to the world as a result of human impact such as rainforest destruction and global warming

English

Holes by Louis Sacher is a short novel that we will be reading and working with. It is about Stanley Yelnats, a boy who has bad luck due to a curse placed on his great- great-grandfather, he is sent to Camp Green Lake, a juvenile detention camp, for a crime he did not commit. Stanley and the other boys at the camp are forced to dig large holes in the dirt every day.

We will be doing an immense amount of work based around this book.

While we will be developing our spelling and grammar skills, our writing will be focussed on journalism such as biographies, newspapers, articles etc.

Reciprocal Reading is a vital part of our lessons. We will continue to use the VIPERS (vocabulary, infer, predict, explain, retrieve and summarise) to help improve our comprehension skills.

Mathematics

Our key areas of learning this term include:

- Geometry
- Position and Movement
- Measurement
- Perimeter and Area
- Volume
- Roman Numerals

A large part of our daily maths work will be Mental Maths. We have allocated a daily 20 minute session to enhance its fluency. Furthermore, we will be consolidating all of our times tables with the use of Times Table Rock Stars.

A really important part of the study of Maths is also Reasoning. This is the ability to explain why we do things in a certain way to solve problems.
